New Business

Guests introduced. Our county library representatives, Ashley and Wanda, gave the latest info on the library building updates. Pictures of the projected view of the new facility were passed to our residents in attendance. The recent meeting for this project (Nov 18) was mentioned. The link for the meeting minutes will be sent to us. The project is in the design phase. Architect bids will be reviewed this, Summer. Our new library will be renovated, from 20,000 to a 40,000-sf building and will have 150 parking spaces, previously 108. Their larger events, like Trunk-or-Treat, may be moved to another facility. Next topic was a notice we received from the Dept of Agriculture. Mosquito fogging will begin throughout our community soon. They will be fogging in our neighborhood on Thursday nights from 7 pm to 2am during the dates June 3rd to October 6th.
